It is a separate non-profit entity (80G certified).</p> <p>WHAT ARE WE DOING: To promulgate sustainable agricultural practices in the country, the programme works on the following three-pronged principle: - Enabling higher and sustainable crop yield; - Training farmers to be self capacitated in their farms; - Transforming myth and belief based farming into scientific based farming.</p> <p>The Foundation has set up the following institutional platforms - 1. Kalpavriksha Knowledge Centres that impart knowledge to farmers regarding best management practices for farming with the help of SMEs. Farmers undergo these trainings under the guidance of agronomists in areas such as pest, disease, water management, soil health and others. 2. Agribusiness centres (ABCs) which are agri clinics where farmers can obtain farm care inputs along with a plethora of technical services. Additionally, to support those farmers who cannot normally afford purchasing farm machineries, the ABC provides access to high-quality farm equipment on hire. ABC also provides them access to labourers to work on their farms on need basis, along with inputs. These agri-ventures are established with the help of local entrepreneurs who provide services like hiring of farm equipment like Rotavator, power tiller, sale of inputs along with labour services at affordable prices.</p> <p>FOR WHOM: Small-scale farmers</p> <p>Habitat Restoration through Afforestation</p> <p>WHY IS IT IMPORTANT: Afforestation is essential to sustain and restore ecosystem balance. It helps nurture biodiversity, conserve water, preserve soil, and control physical risks related to climate change</p> <p>WHAT ARE WE DOING: Plantation of trees with help of local community and farmers to increase green cover in specified areas, growing fruit orchards on barren farmlands, generating livelihood for farmer community.
